Ten easy steps to becoming a 4-H Leader!

1. Get in touch with the Hunterdon County 4-H Program Assistant
2. Fill out the application form, participate in our leader training and do the online training.
3. Recruit members (at least five)
4. Select a topic for your club
5. Select a meeting place, either your home, a church, local school, or the Hunterdon County Extension Center.
6. Select a name for your club.
7. Hold a business meeting at least once a month which would include pledges, business meeting, educational program and recreation
8. Elect officers for your club
9. Get your parents interested and involved
10. Plan a calendar, which includes meeting dates, activities, field trips, "hands on" activities and recreation.
