## **EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT**

### **COMMENTS:**

- Attended State EMS Coordinator Meetings;
- VHF – high band radios were issued to the EMS Coordinator and all 4 Deputy EMS Coordinators;
- NJ Festival of Ballooning assistance was provided with a joint effort between Hunterdon and Somerset County EMS Coordinators;
- EMS Coordinator pager tones were developed and put into service;
- Revisions to the alerting procedure for EMS Coordinator was made;
- Participated in 15 conference calls with State DOH official, County OEM EMS Coordinators, NJSP, and other stakeholders during Hurricane Sandy;
- Deployed 3 Type IV Ambulance Strike Team to Brick Twp., NJ as part of Super - storm Hurricane Sandy mutual aid requests to southern NJ (Clinton, Flemington-Raritan, Quakertown FD BLS);
- Hunterdon County EOC EMS Desk was staffed for upwards of 96 hours ranging from prior to Sandy's landfall and for the two weeks thereafter;
- Received delivery of two Rehab Trucks purchased with grant funds to be used as part of a regionalized north and south rehab response. Implementation continues for this project;
- Dual Band portable and mobile radio issued to the EMS Coordinator to assist in communicating with surrounding counties;
- Attended multiple training sessions around the State.

**County Coordinator & Deputy Coordinator:** 153 Responses. (121/workday;41/after hours; meet/events after hours)

**Bureau of Fire / Fire Coordinators:** 45 responses, 19 meetings, 500 volunteer man hours.

**Bureau of EMS / EMS Coordinators:** 27 responses, 30 meetings, 715 volunteer man hours.

**Emergency Services Training Center:** 2708 certificates issued; 161 courses held.

**Hazardous Materials Response Team:** 13 responses, 12 meetings, 16 drills.

**Mobile Command Post:** 30 emergency response; non-emergency response/stand-bys
