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PHARMACEUTICAL OPTIONS

The Hunterdon County Division of Senior Services has prepared this list of sources of prescription drugs to Hunterdon County seniors. It is not all-inclusive, and it does not constitute an endorsement or recommendation by the Division of Senior Services. Calling for cost comparisons is suggested.

PHARMACEUTICAL PROGRAMS

1. PAAD (Pharmaceutical Assistance for the Aged and Disabled)

PAAD is a New Jersey program offering prescriptions for \$5-\$10.00. Eligibility limits are total annual income up to \$27,189 for single individuals and \$33,334 for married couples.

2. Senior Gold

Senior Gold is a New Jersey program through which individual seniors with annual incomes for \$37,189, and married couples with annual incomes up to \$43,334 can receive a 50 percent discount on prescriptions after meeting a \$15 co-pay. After annual out-of-pocket expenditures exceed \$2,000 for individuals or \$3,000 for couples, for the remainder of the year only the \$15 co-pay must be paid for each medication.

3. Select Solutions

The Hunterdon County Resident Prescription Savings Program is designed to provide Hunterdon County residents with savings of up to 10% to 50% on prescription medications. All residents of Hunterdon County and their dependents (living in the same house hold). There are no age restrictions, no income requirements or exclusions for pre-existing conditions. Annual membership fee is \$20.00.

4. Together RX Access

The Together RX Access is a free savings program that helps qualified individuals and families save on more than 275 brand name prescriptions drugs coverage. Household income must equal to or less than \$45,000 for a single person.

VETERANS:

Veterans who are rated less than 50% service-connected, and non-service connected veterans, who report to a VA facility and are receiving prescriptions for a non-services-connected condition, may obtain their prescriptions from a VA pharmacy for \$11.00 for each 30-day or less supply. The \$11.00 charge also applies to “over-the-counter” medications such as aspirin, cough syrup, vitamins, etc. The \$11.00 charge applies only to medications but does not include medical supplies such as syringes.

Veterans with service-connected conditions may obtain medications from a VA pharmacy for free. Call..... 1-800-624-0508

Tricare Senior Pharmacy Program 1-877-363-6337

Medicare-eligible retirees of the uniformed services, their family members and survivors have access to prescription drugs not only at military treatment facilities, but also at retail pharmacies and through the national mail order service program. Retired military may call the telephone number listed above for additional information.

HOSPITAL PHARMACIES:

If an individual is receiving health care from a physician who is associated with a particular hospital, or is receiving health care from a hospital clinic, he/she may wish to inquire about using the hospital's pharmacy for the purchase of prescription medications. Since hospitals generally receive discounts on the prescription medications they use in the treatment of their patients, individuals may be able to take advantage of these discounts by purchasing prescription medications from the hospital's pharmacy.
